

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The building at 8293 County Road is set on a standard lot, located on the south side of the street between Stahley Road and Heiss Road. County Road is a residential east-west corridor in the Swormville section of the Town of Clarence. This 2½-story, hipped roof, Queen Anne is three bays wide by three bays deep with wood clapboard and shingle siding. A large, one-story addition is to the rear. A modern, matching three car garage with dormers to the rear (south east). A medium-sized gambrel-roofed front gables barn is on the side lot to the east.

The primary entrance is protected by a full-width, single-story column supported porch with wood rail. The gabled dormers on the three public facades have two smaller double hung windows.

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
The building at 8346 County Road is set on a large, irregularly-shaped lot, located on the north side of the street between Stahley Road and Heiss Road. County Road is a residential east-west corridor in the Swormville section of the Town of Clarence. This 2½-story, cross gabled, vernacular Queen Anne is four bays wide at the cross by four bays deep and has wood shingle siding and a stone foundation. A large addition is to the rear as is a detached two car garage. Numerous other large outbuildings scattered to the west, north and east.

The entrance is in the east bay of the front projecting gable protected by the hipped roof, open, wraparound porch. A large window is to the west. Two smaller one over one double-hung replacement windows are located in the second story. Another matching window is in the pent enclosed gable attic. All the windows are enframed with simple detailing.


The building at 8600 County Road is set on a large parcel located on the north side of the street between Green Acres Road and Stahley Road. County Road is a residential east-west corridor in the Swormville section of the Town of Clarence. This 2-story, cross gabled, simple, vernacular, frame folk dwelling has asbestos shingle siding and each block is two bays wide by two bays deep. There is a small, one-story rear addition. To the north and west is a large barn, a smaller barn and two other outbuildings in roughly a U shape. To the far west is a modern greenhouse.

The primary entrance is in the west block, beneath the open porch in the L. Old wood windowing with modest, round topped framing remains.

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
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The building at 8670 County Road is set on a large, 62.84 acre parcel, located on the north side of the street between Green Acres Road and Heise Road. County Road is a residential east-west corridor in the Swormville section of the Town of Clarence. The 2-story, side gabled, simple, vernacular, frame folk dwelling is two bays wide by two bays deep and sets on a rough stone foundation. A large, likely historic, two story addition is to the rear. A smaller one story addition is to the west. The building is sided with asbestos siding. The fenestration is even and the primary entrance is on the west side. A large, fairly intact barn complex is also to the west.

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
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The building at 8777 County Road is set on a standard lot, located on the south side of the street between Heise Road and Goodrich Road. County Road is a residential east-west corridor in the Swormville section of the Town of Clarence. The 2-story, cross gabled, simple, vernacular, frame folk dwelling has two blocks each two bays wide and three bays deep with wood clapboard siding and a stone foundation. A large two-story, likely historic, addition is to the rear. A smaller one story addition adjoins the original building and 2 story addition and a third addition runs across the entire rear. A large historic barn and modern garage are to southwest. The primary entrance is beneath the open front porch in the L. An additional west side enclosed entrance is located in the rear addition.
