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The building at 10625 Miland Road is set on a large lot, located on the east side of the street between Berghorn Road and Salt Road. Miland Road is a residential east-west corridor in the north-western section of the Town of Clarence. This 2-story, cross gabled, Victorian frame building with high period influences and detail has been vinyl sided but has good remaining character and style. The primary entrance is protected by an open spindle work porch in the L. The windows are shaped and enframed. To the north is an old silo and remaining barn and smaller outbuildings.

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

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

Miland Road is a residential east-west corridor in the north-western section of the Town of Clarence. This 2-story, side gabled, vernacular, frame folk building has vinyl siding, a new concrete chimney, a replaced foundation and a rear porch and addition. A large gambrel roofed barn is to the north.
